Planning Application No: 3/2022/0185

Proposal: Demolition of existing rear conservatory and construction of single

storey extensions to front, side and rear, alterations to front garden.

Location: 7 Timbrills Avenue Sabden BB7 9HF

I have viewed the plans and the highway related documents submitted; I have the following comments to make:

The property is situated on a turning head and parking is not acceptable on the turning head for highway safety reasons.

An investigation of the 5 year accident record shows no collisions have occurred on Timbrills Aveune.

The proposal sees the loss of a garage but the applicant has provided 2 parking spaces (ref. Proposed Plans and Elevations, Sept 2021, 6417-PO1 Rev A) within the curtilage which meet parking standards for a 2 bedroom property.

There is no objection to this proposal on highway grounds, but I would recommend the following condition:

## Condition

 The parking areas must be constructed of a bound porous material and created before first occupation up until the life time of the dwelling existing in its proposed state. Reason: to ensure that satisfactory parking is provided before the dwelling hereby permitted becomes operative.
