Installation of BT apparatus: Apparatus Type CCC No. 5

**Location: CHATBURN TELEPHONE EXCHANGE CROW TREES BROW CLITHEROE ROAD
CHATBURN LANCS BB7 4LA**

It is noticed that BT telecom apparatus (Type CCC No 5) have overall dimensions of 650mmX1130mmX285mm. It is a metal cabinet with door opening across the width of the cabinet. Proposed installation of the BT cabinet is on the footway adjacent to existing telephone exchange on Crow Trees Brow.

Existing width of the footway at the location of proposed cabinet is 2.5m. Installation of cabinet will be adjacent to the boundary wall to front side of the property. It is believed that depth of the cabinet (285mm) will project across the width of the footway. Thus width of the footway will reduce at the location of cabinet installation. It is believed that approximate width of the footway will be 2.2m at the location of cabinet. According to manual for streets the available width of footway will be sufficient to accommodate a wheel chair along side a pedestrian using the footway.

There is no objection to the proposal of erection of BT cabinet at proposed location provided the depth of cabinet (285mm) is projection across the footway.
