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Heritage Statement

Historical Use.

The site is located on Back King Street (Adopted Road), Whalley, the current buildings on the site have been used in the past as industrial units and ancillary storage, with garages to the north of the site, currently used as storage.

Present Condition

The site is currently in an untidy state, the current buildings have an aged appearance, which detract from the wider landscape, and they are built from a selection of brick and render finishes, with pitched corrugated cement sheets for the roof.

Context

The large village of Whalley is situated in Lancashire, just north of Blackburn, the site sits in the Whalley conservation area, but does not commend the village in anyway. The site is an eyesore to the current street scape of the village.

Proposals

As the Design and Access Statement Suggests, it is proposes to demolish the current buildings situated on the site, and construct a much needed car park in this ideal location in the village, the proposed demolition will help improve the landscape of the village, and will provide not only extra natural light to neighbouring properties, but much needed space for the car park will consist of 60 spaces and will serve the village and its surroundings.
