Conditions

1. Any external source of lighting shall be effectively screened from the view of a driver on the adjoining public highway. Reason: To avoid glare, dazzle or distraction to passing motorists.
2. The limits of the illuminance shall not exceed those described in paragraph two of Schedule 3 Part II of the Town and Country Planning Act (Control of Advertisements) Regulations 1992. Reason: To avoid glare, dazzle or distraction to passing motorists.
