Whilst I note there are some improvements to the proposals previously submitted in respect to the proposals for the formation of the site access, the fundamental issue of the intensification of the use of the access together with the visibility for the access still remain unanswered. Without the benefit of a speed survey adjacent to the proposed access the required sightlines for the speed limit on this road (60mph) is 215m which will also be appropriate for the stopping sight distance (SSD) for vehicles wishing to turn right into the entrance. The applicant has stated within the D&A that the visibility in either direction is approx. 150m with a SSD of 73m.

On the basis of this I would have to reiterate my highway objection to the proposal on the grounds previously stated
