

Dear Sir,

The right hand side of the bungalow has an irish oak garage door, and front door, this is the same colour and texture as the partial cladding we have placed on part of the garden room. In our opinion this is tying the new extension and existing building together. The facade of the extension is obscured by trees and is therefore not too overpowering. 70% of the ~~new~~ opposite side is the left hand side of the bungalow where the garden room is situated has been 'k' rendered. We also considered that due

to the close proximity of the trees, I
rend often stains with a green residue
from the plants & vegetation as was
noticed by Mr Clarkson on his inspection.
This cladding is easily jet washed
and will keep a better colour should
green algae appear. We also considered
the cladding to give a better definition
to the property, and to be in keeping
with a few houses opposite our
building which all have cladding over
the bay windows albeit white.
We consider the cladding to be in keeping
with the rest of the buildings and houses
around us, and we have received only
positive comments from neighbours. On
viewing many new builds in the area,
this type of cladding is being used and
is easily maintained. In our opinion it
has only improved the appearance.
