Afternoon Stephen,

The parking provision required for the proposed apartments 11 spaces. There are 12 spaces proposed. I am mindful of an application made in 2014 ( 2014/0999) which split the adjacent dwelling into 2 residential units and provided 3 parking spaces on the adjacent land which is currently the proposed car park. I am unsure if the 2014 permission was implemented but I would need to know what parking will be retained for the existing dwelling(s) along with those required for the proposed development.

Looking at the proposed car parking arrangements only parking spaces 8,9,10,11 and 12 have sufficient room for vehicles to reverse into when exiting the car parking spaces, the remainder lack the standard 6m reversing zone. This effectively reduces the parking provision to 5 spaces , notwithstanding the requirements , of the existing dwelling(s).

As submitted it is likely that the application will be recommended for a refusal on the grounds of insufficient parking provision
