



T1 – Horse Chestnut (17m)

Tree is dead. Major dead wood over public footpath.
Remove tree. Possible to leave as a monolith to encourage habitat.



T2 – Ash (17m)

Considerable dieback and deadwood in the crown. Over public footpath. Suppressing neighbouring yew tree (T3).
Remove.



Public footpath next to the river

Needs trimming and tidying to clear footpath.



T4 – Yew (16m)

Considerable dieback in the crown. Minor stem bleeds. Client would like this removed and them stem carved for aesthetic impact.



T5 – Fallen Beech

Tree has failed at root plate, fruiting bodies of Ganoderma present. Remove.



T6 – Beech (22m)

Die back in the crown/tips, leaning towards entrance road with slight root plate lift. Cracking and small stem bleeds at the base. Remove.



G1 – Horse Chesnut/Beech (24m)

Crown raise/remove epicormic growth



T8 – Holly

Half crown is dead with dieback in other parts. Remove.
Replant.



T9 – Weeping ash

Major dieback in the crown, remove and replant.



G2 – Conifers/evergreens mixed species (15m)

Crown lift and generally tidy group with the aim of a view through the group to the other side and enable planting underneath for aesthetic purposes.



G3 – Mixed shelterbelt – Beech, horse chestnut, ash (23m)

Crown raise to 3m, remove epicormic growth for aesthetics and to be able to plant flowers/shrubs underneath. Remove lower wounded branch with stem bleeds from horse chestnut.





G4 – Yew (15m)

Crown raise to allow planting underneath and enhance aesthetics, remove major deadwood.
