Thank you for consulting us on the EIA Scoping request for the installation of tunnelled pipework at the Bowland Section of the Haweswater Aqueduct and associated works (ref Application 3/2019/0977) and EIA scoping request for the installation of tunnelled pipework at the Marl Hill Section of the Haweswater Aqueduct and associated works (ref Application 3/2019/0977).
