Thank you for your email and for letting me know about this.

Yes, in the interests of speed, please accept our comments (attached) for the Bowland section as also applying to the Marl Hill section as well as the general points are the same.

Regarding the Transport Assessment (TA), I think the main issue that United Utilities have at the moment is that they aren't able to have a detailed understanding of the frequency, timing and routing of traffic movements until later in the development of these projects and when contractors are appointed (who will know the numbers of site employees, shift patterns and have a plan in mind for the transportation of plant and excavated material). That said, our comments so far clarify what we'll be expecting to see in the (TA).
