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Works schedule for :

T1 Conifer : Right on the boundary of the land between customer and neighbour. Tree is positioned next to the gate way access for neighbours main access drive. Removal of this unsightly tree to facilitate a new boundary fence being erected and tidy up around the gate area / post.

T2 Birch : Small diameter tall leggy birch growing out at an approx 30 degree angle over the customers drive and main access for next door. Remove tree.

T3 Hawthorn : Large mature specimen. Will be in the way for customers access into the land with the rpz etc. If it had to be maintained and kept on site the customer would want a sizeable reduction which for aesthetics would not be pleasant nor natural. Ideally removal of the tree.

T4 Birch : Small diameter tall leggy birch growing out at an approx 30 degree angle over the customers drive and main access for next door + pavement area. Remove tree.

T5 Sycamore : Most likely a self set tree that requires room to grow so has grown out towards the pavement. Removal of this tree so other more suited tree's could be planted within a planting scheme. This would also help open up the view to the lime tree's and holly behind (much nicer tree's).

T6 Cherry : Growing through the crown of a sycamore tree. Tree has no potential, suspect self set and would advise removal of this tree.

T7 Sycamore : On the corner of the boundary wall over hanging the pavement causing issues to pedestrians etc. This tree is multi stems that are growing from a rotten stump. Suggest lapsed regrowth from an old tree removal. Removal of this for safety reasons.

T8 Oak : Tree has significant dieback within the crown and debris is in falling distance of busy main road. Removal of this tree.

T9 Lime : Crown lift lower epicormic growth to crown break. Reduce back lower overhanging limb (to the main rd to settle) by approx 2.5m to bring back into line of the rest of the crown.

T10 – 2 options – Remove basal growth and smaller stem. Option 2.... the tree is situated between 2 large lime tree's. It is right next to the street light. There has been some recent pruning works to the tree that has lifted the crown very high, possibly for streetlight purposes. Most of the crown is heavily weighted towards the road, pruning cuts do not look the best and will only result in epicormic regrowth which will need constantly maintaining to keep clear for the streetlight. I do not

see this tree as worthy of keeping due to the above factors. I think it would be a lot nicer view to open up the mature lime tree's behind which are more inkeeping with the plot and area.

T11 Lime – No works at present

T12 Hawthorn - small hawthorn, approx 6-8" diameter possibly 20' tall. This tree will be in the way for my customers use of the land. Removal of this tree.

T13 Sycamore – This tree is suppressed due to the larger tree's on site and its crown is all one sided leaning back into the land. Removal of this tree.

T14 Lime – No work at present

T15 Holly – Smaller of the 2 holly's. This tree grows into T16 holly. Removal of this tree to open up the space and allow to keep and maintain T16 holly as a natural shape.

T16 Holly – Maintain and possibly tidy up the side where T15 holly has been removed to keep in shape.

This corner / piece of land has been neglected for many years. Most of the tree's for removal would be self set tree's. This piece of land has the potential to be tidied up for the customer but also for the residents of Gisburn. My customer is willing to work with the council with replanting some suitable agreeable specimens as replacements. The works are quite radical but are what's needed to make use of the area and to keep it a safe area for pedestrians / the customer and their family. Remaining tree's are to be deadwooded at some point in the future. By the removal of these tree's it also allows the customer to keep an eye on the remaining tree's to keep them in good health and managed. The customer is aware the tree's are next to two busy main roads and is actively looking to manage the tree's the best way possible.

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
