e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

Trees numbers 1 to 4 all require the work described below to increase amenity value of trees, to increase light, to encourage more balanced growth (the trees are searching for light) and for safety reasons (a number of very hefty branches have fallen from the trees). All the trees contribute towards excessive shading of the garden.

No. 1 Oak - Thin and lift crown, clean out and dead wood. Remove epicormic growth. Reduction of limb extending towards house (see attached photos).

No. 2 Oak- This tree has no amenity value because of proximity to other trees. Growth is just to one side. Ideally we would like the tree to be felled. If not possible then thin crown, cleanout, dead wood and reduce limbs that extend over the road.

No. 3 Horse Chestnut - Thin crown, clean out and dead wood.

No. 4 Horse Chestnut - Thin crown, clean out and dead wood.

No. 5 Hornbeam - Diseased at base. Tyrone Morgan has recommended that the tree is felled. I do not have a written report from him - he advised verbally. Please see photos. If you are unable to consider this tree as part of the application because I do not have written evidence, please still consider the other trees and we will deal with this one separately.
