Application Site: Smithy Cottage Birks Brow Proposal: Erect lodge on Agricultural Land

I have previously been consulted on a similar application under application number under application 2019/0773 which was subsequently withdrawn. Commenting on the 2019 application I made the following comments regarding the proposed access

The proposed development proposes to utilise an existing access that has recently been constructed off Birks Brow. This access was not evident on the latest Google Streetview pass for this length of road (2011) and is therefore considered recent.

Unfortunately, the siting of the access has taken no regard to the proximity of the Birks Brow / Forty Acre Lane junction. Whilst this may be considered acceptable for an infrequent farm machinery access, the proposed use for a holiday lodge access (with aspirations for a second unit expressed within the application documents) would place a higher movement through this access with its inherent safety concerns with regard to access manoeuvres both to and from Forty Acre Lane. This issue is further compounded by the retention of a section of hedge fronting Forty Acre Lane which obstructs visibility to the left for vehicles entering the junction from Birks Brow. This hedge is contained within the blue edge of the application. If this hedge were to be removed it would significantly increase the all-round visibility at this junction and allow me to raise no objection to the proposal.

If the hedge is to be retained, then I would have to raise an objection to the proposal on highway safety grounds due to the visibility limitations at this junction. These concerns remain pertinent to this current application and unless the situation with regards to visibility is addressed I would have to repeat my previous recommendation that the application be refused on highway safety grounds.
