



Hi George

I forwarded your email to a Planning Officer whose had a quick look at it and they have responded with the bullet point advice below.

- Difficult to assess correctly as its not complete
- it's slightly over PD if it's 2.6 metres high and within 2 metres of the boundary so it would be advisable to get it to 2.5 metres high

- Need to make sure its not be capable of self-contained living accommodation. A bar and toilet would probably be ok but if it is more of an annexe then it needs permission.
- The only way to formally confirm if its Permitted Development is via a certificate of lawfulness so you could invite an application
