Dear Dave / Alex,

RE: TPO application to remove 1x Oak tree: 2 Barley Close, Whalley, Clitheroe.

I am writing to you on behalf of my client, Jason Connor with a request to remove 1x oak tree (T269) located within the residential garden of 2 Barley Close, Whalley, Clitheroe.

The reason for removal is to allow essential grounds works to be undertaken to mitigate extensive drainage and flooding issues on site. The necessary new drainage that needs to be installed will require trenching through the root protection area of the tree causing damage to the rooting volume and long-term detriment to the tree.

There is some existing drainage located along the side of the house, at present this is inadequate for the needs and a larger drain and new manhole is needed further into the centre of the garden.

A drawing of the existing drainage system and proposed new layout is attached to this report.

The tree was at the time of assessment in good condition but had not yet come into leaf, the canopy is heavily suppressed with a dominant canopy leaning towards the house, this suppressed growth is due to the existing trees located to the north, T274 and T275.

A recent application was submitted and give consent to remove several trees to the land parcel to the north, this is to allow again extensive land drains to be installed and again with the impact on the tree roots, consent was given to remove several trees, this includes T274 and T275, the removal of these 2 trees will leave T269 exposed.























To mitigate the removal of this tree replacement tree planting is suggested and can be located within the parcel of land owned by my client, 2x oak trees that are heavy standard in size are suggested as replacement trees. this can be confirmed, or other suggestions made by the tree officer as needed.

My client has plans in the future to extend the existing property to create a larger single-story kitchen, it would be possible to construct this with minimal impact on the tree using raised foundations and a piling system, this would not be required if the tree were removed.

It must be stressed that the primary reason for removing the tree is to mitigate the extensive flooding and risk to property that currently occurs.
