I am writing this email again as I don't appear to have had any acknowledgement from my last email.

I would like to advise you of [REDACTED] concerns with regard to the above Harp work and request that you forward it to the relevant departments. [REDACTED] at the top of [REDACTED] at either side of the road. The current road markings mean that vehicles are going to try to pass the lorries directly [REDACTED] and the 2 junctions of Easington and Cow Ark, as there does not appear to be any plans for an overtaking layby at the top of Hallgate Hill. This already is very dangerous and [REDACTED] have witnessed many 'near misses' over the years. Please can you arrange a site visit as soon as possible so that the issue can be resolved before the work begins. [REDACTED] feel that it should be double white lines after the crest of the hill and [REDACTED] obvious junction markings or there will be a serious accident. [REDACTED] are constantly crossing the road either on foot or with large vehicles, tractors and of course livestock, [REDACTED] feel that unless new road markings are put in place soon, an accident is highly likely.
