We write in response to the above application. We are residents of [REDACTED] West Bradford for the [REDACTED] and are concerned about this development with particular concerns about the impact on proposed road traffic on Waddington Road, West Bradford of Option 1 of the haul route, especially on the sharp bends west of The Three Millstones restaurant at the junction with Eaves Hall Lane. The prospect of upto 160 vehicles per day, including "AIL's", raises very significant concerns on road safety, and access to the road network by residents of Eaves Hall Lane . Primarily for these reasons we strongly support the consultation response document submitted by West Bradford Parish Council, for planning permission for Haul Route 1 to be denied and that Haul Route 2 ( the construction of a temporary bridge over River Ribble and temporary roadway to Waddington Road west of Coplow Bridge) be granted permission with the caveats in the Parish Council document included in the permission.
