Your Comments: The extension no.4 has erected is not only an eye sore however is a serious fire hazard, despite the structure being built so close their direct neighbours fence, the garden of number 4 is full of flammable materials / junk that resembles a scrap yard that can be seen from the majority of peoples upstairs windows. I have worked in the building / engineering trade for circa 12 years and can see when something is clearly unsafe. The initial gazebo

erected was being used as a permanent structure built on decking which was dangerous enough, however when they decided to erect the more "stable" alternative and by doing this they have not taken into consideration any of the surrounding neighbours feelings when building a permanent feature of their house by using cheap plexi glass and an old gazebo frame. We have not paid all the money we have to move into a nice house and area to look out of [REDACTED] to see a make shift shack built in a scrap heap back garden. They have clearly not done their research into structures being built so close to adjacent fences and of the correct height. As this has been erected by the family at number 4 and not a professional the hazards and the potential for the structure to collapse / set on fire are ridiculously high. This can also be seen from the pavement when walking or [REDACTED] I'm unsure whether Sage housing have intervened as they have now taken down the roof, they have however covered it with a black sheet. Which makes me think they haven't listened to their landlord as I'm almost certain this would not be allowed under the terms of their tenancy. [REDACTED]
