<ul> <li>Main Objections:</li> <li>1. Size and proportion</li> <li>RVBC have previously declined 2 applications for this front loft conversion because of its sheer size and lack of proportion or sympathy for the original design of our adjoining bungalows or the others in our street.</li> <li>Precise measurements have been omitted on all these latest plans. Only measurement scales appear, not aligned with the diagrams.</li> </ul>
The proposed front dormer appears not much smaller, nearly half of the descending roof space, different from all other bungalows on our road.
- The only measurements given are for the redesigned brick "porch": "approx"  2.570 m x "approx" 1.575 m.  of 1.80 m x 1.30 m, and together with the raised pitched roof ascending into the main roof above the eaves, is of a proportion more akin to a front extension wing. Even on the diagram, the "porch" extension is proportionate to two thirds of a downstairs room, or a quarter of the depth of the house,  2. Noise, distress and disturbance
