This is a cedar tree in the front garden of my house. I have had an arborist look at and he advises that it should be felled. He has said that it is a Mature specimen, full crown of foliage with the weight significantly unbalanced due to evidence of suppressed growth. A visible lean over the road can be observed with slight raising of the ground/soil at the root plate. Previous pruning cuts look to be of poor quality with minimal signs of occlusion. It is for this reason that I would like to remove it. I made an earlier application that I withdrew on advice of the council, pending professional advice.
