Comments: I oppose the above application for the reasons outlined below.

- The strict limits on car parking spaces in the proposal do not allow for a further increase in covers, with overlap which will increase the need due to the perceived change from a greater dining only experience to that of a drinking establishment. This would strongly suggest (as public transport is infrequent) that car park spaces are inadequate to also cater for additional staffing requirements. It follows that some drivers will park on the adjoining narrow road which is unsafe & unacceptable, blocking residents driveways. The adjoining junctions are blind to traffic travelling along Whalley Road to Mellor Brow. Any additional risk of accidents should to be avoided.
- The markings of the roundabout outside of pub have almost disappeared, perhaps Highways should make a site visit and see the increased risk of an accident with an increase in drivers unfamiliar with the road.
- For the applicant to quote "For those using public transport, there are three bus stops within easy walking distance", very little research has put into the application, shows no local knowledge and clearly no interest in the amenity for residents. Buses stop early evening, reduced timetable on a Saturday and don't run on a Sunday!
- A larger outdoor eating area would impact local residents combined with the fact that the premises are proposed to be open 7 days per week. The increase in noise pollution is unacceptable for local residents.
- The proposed additions to the overall footprint of the site would have a negative impact on the local properties, restricting the residents' rights to privacy & lack of disturbance in their own homes & gardens, which is unacceptable.
- The entertainment licence at present does not allow for outdoor music etc and it is strongly requested that it must remain so. Concerns that late night drinking outdoors until after 23.00 hours would be unacceptable to local residents from a noise and nuisance perspective. The current Premises Licence restricts such activity, and it is requested that, should the application be approved, the terms of the Premises Licence and its additional restrictions are upheld & not extended.
