## **Advice to Local Planning Authority**

The Local Highway Authority (LHA) are in receipt of an application for the proposed extension at 20 The Sands, Whalley.

The LHA are aware of the most recent planning history at the site with it being listed below:

3/2014/1102- Single storey side and rear extension to dwelling. Permitted 02/02/2015.

The LHA are aware that the dwelling will continue to be accessed off The Sands which is an unclassified road subject to a 20mph speed limit.

The LHA have reviewed the supporting documents and understands that the dwelling will become a 4-bed following the proposal. For the site to comply with the LHAs parking guidance as defined in the Joint Lancashire Structure Plan, the LHA require 3 car parking spaces to be provided on site.

Therefore, to ensure that the site can provide the minimum parking requirement, the LHA are requesting that a parking plan is submitted so that the LHA can fully assess the application.
