Comments: I object to the installation of two digital 75 inch LD display screens on a street hub because of the proximity to listed buildings and it is not appropriate to the historic core of the town centre with the modern appearance of the hub, creating street clutter and the lighting associated with it. Standing 6 feet high there are road safety implications with pedestrians emerging from behind it. There are more sympathetic ways of providing the facilities that BT list of the hub, the location is inappropriate, note the more discreet location of the phone box in Market Place.
