I wish to strongly oppose this application.

Such illuminated signage has no place in a village.

Its proposed location is virtually [REDACTED] The constantly changing display would constitute a serious nuisance for us and nearby residents. Adjacent to a busy zebra crossing. It would be a potentially dangerous distraction for both drivers and pedestrians .

The recently enlarged pavement area outside CJ's has become an attractive space where people stop to chat, right in the middle of the village and opposite Vale Gardens, a fine and entirely appropriate amenity which both residents and visitors enjoy. It is inconceivable that a constantly changing illuminated sign should be allowed to invade such an attractive space.

Comments: I object to this proposed development on the grounds that it is out of keeping in this conservation area & it could pose a danger to pedestrians & drivers.

Whalley is a picturesque village within a designated conservation area. The proposed signage in the heart of the village is a large modern illuminated structure totally out of keeping with the existing area. The council has strived to ensure that most other development applications have adhered to the planning strategy for the area & I believe this application should fail on this point alone.

The proposed structure is potentially hazardous to drivers & pedestrians. An illuminated structure of this magnitude located in the immediate vicinity of the bus stop, pedestrian crossing, junction with George street & the entrance & exit from the bus terminal will distract drivers approaching & leaving these existing hazards & endanger other drivers & pedestrians. The signage is specifically designed to attract attention & for this reason it is totally inappropriate to locate it in such a hazardous spot.
