This building was never granted planning consent as a residential home; it states in the planning application 3/2018/0989 that permission was granted for: Item 4 The building hereby permitted shall be used for agricultural purposes only (as defined in Section 336 (1) of the Town and County Planning Act 1990) Item 5 The building hereby permitted shall not be used for the housing of any livestock at any time, without prior written consent from the Local Planning Authority "Any livestock at any time"? We assume that also covers human beings. Surely had no permission for residential use. If he has lived there and I assume he has far as we are aware. When the land was up for sale there was no electricity or water connected to the field. Is the water connection known to United Utilities or the electricity board? Subsequently, the electricity board disconnected an illegal supply and dyed the soil red to prevent further connection in that area. The solar panels appeared at a later date with no known planning consent. The septic tank which is mentioned in the We know you are no longer permitted to have a septic tank and any change of property ownership or a new build has to have a water treatment plant installed to comply with legislation set out by the government. We question, what has happened to the enforcement notice that does not appear to have ever been implemented and of the planning system.

He also on occasion has caravans, mobile homes and tents in the field and parties and music into the early hours

The field is unkempt and in a constant state of untidiness and lots of debris are left lying about and redundant

machinery is left in open sight. This is to the detriment of the visual impact on open countryside

during summer.
