Subject: objection to 3/2023/0858



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For the attention of Kathryn Hughes re 3/2023/0858 (retention of wedding marquee & raised decking to west of the main build of Stanley House)

I have recently spoken to [REDACTED] & to my disappointment discovered the planning application as indicated above . I hope I am not too late to ask you to consider my objections as listed below.

1. The marquee is completely out of keeping in design , colour & concept as part of Stanley House is a listed building & in a rural setting.
2. The light pollution - the bright lights late at night cause annoyance to neighbours & will affect wildlife.
3. When an event is on the noise pollution is considerable. [REDACTED] the doors were open & acoustic blinds not down when an event was underway . Noise affects both neighbours, livestock & wildlife.
4. Increased use of [REDACTED] when attendees to functions miss the turning to Stanley House or are on their way home late at night causes annoyance & disturbed sleep . Importantly there is increased erosion of the grass verges & natural banks supporting hedges . If the soil banks collapse it will cause problems of access along the lane.
5. The event company has had sufficient time to pilot events in the marquee . They should now remove the temporary structure of the marquee completely & decide whether their events are viable . If their business is viable then a permanent structure could be built which would tackle the problems of noise & light pollution, complement the architecture of Stanley House & plans made to minimise disturbance to [REDACTED] .
