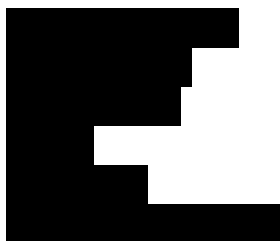

Comments on Planning Application :

Further to my previous comments and after the discussion we had in December please find attached a shorten video clip of the noise nuisance cause by the temporary disco / celebration structure known as the 'Glass Pyramid' and the subject of the application 3/2023/0858. Please note the following :

- Prior to this video I was being disturbed and unable to sleep in my bedroom from the noise coming from the location
- Note this is recorded on a iPhone and the noise is much louder in person, especially with the direct line of sight of my bedroom.
- This is NOT a one off or a Christmas or New Year exception , this happens multiple times a week and continues throughout the year.
- The original noise assessment that has been done and the subsequent one claims that the events are inaudible from [REDACTED], I would like to challenge the noise report on the following points.
 - At no point were the residents involved or consulted on the basis of the report. I.e. the direct line of sight from bedrooms etc where not tested in anyway.
 - The sound/Music chosen was not representative of a real event.
 - The background noise quoted was a peak and not an average, if an average was taken the results would have been very different.
 - The background noise levels vary between each report and whatever baseline is used to what appears to be whatever supports the case that they are making.
 - It takes no account of atmospheric conditions and wind – which have a drastic affect on noise transmission.

- If you experience the noise or even watch the video you can do nothing but conclude the report is not worth the paper it is written on.
- I have repeatedly [REDACTED] to experience the noise from my location, they have not once visited me.
- On the night in question [REDACTED], who did not pick up before making the video
- The full version of the video is too big to send but I can make it available on request via a download link.

I would politely ask, Kathryn, if this was your house and this noise was affecting your sleep and mental state if you would expect your council to extend the planning permission on a temporary structure with 'make shift' sound proofing for another 3 Years, or you would as a council tax payer expect common sense and your council to do the right thing ?
