The HET is in agreement with the conclusions reached in 118) & 120) respectively of the Screening Report, namely that the proposals are not likely to have any significant archaeological impact, but that mitigation to reduce any impact is required.

The mitigation proposed in 4.7.3 is considered to be both necessary and appropriate, and the HET would therefore advise that such works are secured by means of the following planning condition:

Condition: No development, site clearance/preparation, or demolition shall take place until the applicant, or their agent or successors in title, has secured the implementation of a programme of archaeological investigation, recording and analysis. This must be carried out in accordance with a written scheme of investigation, which shall first have been submitted to and agreed in writing by the Local Planning Authority. All archaeological works shall be undertaken by an appropriately qualified and experienced professional archaeological contractor and comply with the standards and guidance set out by the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists (CIfA). The development shall be carried out in accordance with the agreed details.

Reason: To ensure and safeguard the investigation and recording of matters of archaeological/historical importance associated with the development.
