I am writing in relation to the above. Myself & [REDACTED] have been looking through the plans etc.

The issue we have currently is the Isofreight that is in-situ in the rear garden.

Are we correct in thinking that planning permission for a container over 2.5 meters high in the UK, unless it's used for a very short period or meets specific permitted development rights, such as being under 2.5m when near a boundary is required?

Are the Council able to check if the container is over 2.5 meters high and within 2 meters of a boundary, specifically my boundary?

I further understand that if the Isofreight is being used for commercial use, then planning permission is required. Is this being used for commercial use?

I believe the Isofreight has been there for around 6 weeks now and is to be a temporary fixture whilst the extension is being built. I further believe that although temporary, the build could take quite some time.

Are you able to look into this matter please?
