Farm description: Extending to approximately 140 hectares, Wiswell Eaves Farm is located within the DS Stock Beck waterbody currently classified in good ecological condition. The herd is housed on cubicles and slurry stored in an uncovered lagoon to the front of the yard.	
Pollutant pressures on farm i.e. water, air, natural flood management:	



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Unroofed silage clamp, FYM store and loafing yard collect high amounts of rainwater causing storage pressures on farm. A high risk overland flow pathway is mapped across the yard in front of the clamp and FYM store.



RP28 roof over livestock feed area:

- The floor under the grant-funded roof should be impermeable to ensure nutrients are managed and not allowed to soak down into land.
- The design of the store should conform with [SSAFO](https://www.gov.uk/guides/capital-grants-higher-tier-capital-grants-and-protection-and-infrastructure-grants-2024) regulations and advice can be sought from susan.larty@environment-agency.gov.uk

Planning Permission – Some capital items e.g., buildings, concreting, tracks etc. will require evidence of planning permission or confirmation from the relevant planning authority that it is not needed. Therefore, applicants will need to refer to the relevant Capital Grant specification and submit the relevant evidence with their grant claim where required.

Public Right of Way - If any works affect a public right of way applicants will need to contact the relevant highways authority to discuss the proposal and seek any necessary consents or support.

Justification to support the above approval or reasons for declining:

- All items included in this approval are advised by CSF.
- Aerial photo (1) above demonstrates clear hydrological connectivity between Wiswell Eaves Farm and DS Stock Beck.
- By covering the silage clamp, rainwater will be diverted away from the yard in a clean condition reducing muck storage and management pressures on farm while reducing pollution pressures locally.
- CSF engagement dates back to 2024.
- There is no indication that these items will damage other environmental interests and there is no suggestion of pollution swapping.
