I am writing in support of the planning application relating to the We Buy Any Car pod located within the grounds of Clitheroe Cricket Club.

We [REDACTED] the [REDACTED] and, therefore, are in a position to comment on the impact the pod has had on the surrounding area. In our experience, it has had no noticeable impact whatsoever. There is no noise, disruption or disturbance from the pod, and it has not affected our enjoyment of our home or the surrounding area in any way.

Clitheroe Cricket Club is a valuable community asset and an important hub within the town. It provides facilities for many young children to learn and play cricket, as well as opportunities for adults through its four senior teams and girls' cricket setup. It is fantastic to see so many youngsters using the facilities throughout the summer.

The landscaping undertaken by the cricket club has also completely screened the pod from view from the roadside. The additional trees and planting have been a positive addition to the area, helping to improve the natural environment and enhance the appearance of the site.

The pod is unobtrusive and has no noticeable effect on the operation of the cricket club or the surrounding residents. Given that [REDACTED], I feel it is important to highlight that we have experienced no noise, traffic disruption, disturbance or other nuisance as a result of its presence.

I therefore fully support the planning application and hope that the Council will take into consideration the lack of any adverse impact on local residents, the effective landscaping and screening of the pod, and the positive contribution that Clitheroe Cricket Club continues to make to the local community.

I am replying to the letter received via the planning application of We Buy Any Car at the Cricket Club.

Although the pod is now covered by a man made mould with trees/plants added to it to make it look more visually pleasing. The difficulty of passing and parking does effect traffic flow and obstruction.

It states they have 5 spaces, looking at the plans there is 5 spaces drawn, however the space is bigger and regular there is way more cars on site. This week there has been 8 and I have attached a photo. It does take days for them to move the cars, however the planning does say that they need to be moved at quiet times.

Well at times, [REDACTED] to people stopping in-front of the pod, getting the car valued whilst the car park is full. [REDACTED] the school using the car park and many cars blocking the passing due to the lines not painted and the gap being a one car in one car out.

If you look at the photos, when all spaces are full, and then the car park exit and entrance for a one track in and out is difficult and obstructed by parked cars.
