Over the plat 10 years we have had to put up with dust,noise et., from the building of the 10 houses on the Old Road.

There were lorries constantly driving through Chatburn to the site almost every day whilst the building was taking place.

The owner of the field [REDACTED] has now achieved planning in principal for a further 9 houses which will be built [REDACTED] As if this is not enough to have the put up with I have read the letter regarding Haweswater Aqueduct Resilience Programme and am appalled at the thought of heavy goods traffic driving through Chatburn for the next 6 years. There is also a possibility of this taking place during the weekend also.

The majority of people who live [REDACTED] as I am and all we want is a little bit of piece to enjoy sitting out in our gardens not to have to put with noise etc., which these heavy goods vehicles would emit. There is also the bridge at West Bradford to consider as it has already been demolished with heavy goods vehicles as it is a very tight bend to negotiate.

I feel that route 2 is the best option although this will still cause major problems Parking for residents of Chatburn will also cause many problems as will disruption to school buses and car users also the HGV emissions and noise which are both detrimental to the environment.

I hope the above will be taken into consideration when making the final decision.
