The section of Ribble Lane running down from Crow Trees Brow to the river is often congested with traffic on account of the residents cars parked on the road outside their houses. It is too narrow for cars to pass necessitating one car to stop to allow the other to pass. In addition it is a main route for agricultural traffic and school buses and is also a very busy junction due the cars pulling in for the shops, Spar and the butchers, which at times causes gueues on Sawley road, Crow Trees Brow, and Ribble Lane.

It is also a meeting place for school children waiting for school buses and parents and children crossing the road on their way to the primary school in Chatburn. This route also goes past Waddington Primary School with the associated potential of a serious incident likely given heavy traffic will be passing on a narrow road over a period of 6 years. There can be no justification for choosing this option over Route 2 which resolves all these issues, has no additional impact or detriment to anyone, cuts out a substantial section of very narrow country road and is clearly a much safer option.
