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As a resident of Chatburn I would like to strongly object to the planning application 3/2021/0660, the route through WestBradford, Grindleton and Chatburn.

For this to go through would be terrible for all concerned with the three villages. The roads and lanes Could not cope with the amount of traffic nearly all being HGV's.

Chatburn, in particular, already suffers with lots of congestion, especially around school times, affecting the local shops and business's etc.

The latest proposal 3/2021/0661 Is a logical and sensible option to which I agree.

Not only will it avoid the problems that would arise in Chatburn, it would avoid West Bradford and the lower part of Grindleton having to cope with extra traffic. It would also avoid having to make major alterations to existing roads for passing places for HGV movements.

The temporary route over the river would take the vehicles directly to the quarry link road to the A59 Clitheroe by-pass-route, built especially for HGV's.

I would hope that all the traffic intended to be using Waddington Road to Clitheroe would be using the temporary route, thus avoiding a large section of the Waddington. This would also avoid the need for HGV's having to travel through Clitheroe via Waddington Road and Chatburn Road- a route that already is very congested and much worse around school times.

I hope you take all these things into consideration.
