I wish to object to the proposed outdoor dining pod at The Lord Nelson.

It is logical to assume that noise levels will be significantly increased , especially in the evenings when sound is magnified.It is possible/likely that the noise might extend a considerable distance.  
There is no car parking provision at The Lord Nelson and therefore cars will have to line the roads, possibly on both sides, and there is the potential to obscure the junction at the top of York Lane.  
The concept seems contrary to the image of a rural Ribble Valley village scene.
