Comments: The road along here is narrow and the pavements on both sides are very narrow, both are often congested with pedestrians and cars. As a pedestrian, crossing safely on any part of that road is difficult at the best of times due to parked cars and traffic from Railway View Avenue and New Market St. joining an already busy thoroughfare. It is hoped the pavement extensions and new crossing points will improve the situation. However, the placement of a large BT Street Hub would negate any advantage to pedestrian safety. This is one of the main thoroughfares in the town within Clitheroe's historic conservation area and is the first view of the town centre when visitors come off the train. The size and nature of the BT Hub would present as an unacceptable and unnecessary intrusion of the streetscape and constitutes advertisement clutter. It would also present as a hazard to other pavement users; wheelchair users, families with prams/pushchairs, the elderly/infirm and those with a visual impairment will be particularly at risk. The visual impact of the large, all day, high brilliance advertising screens would be a distraction to motorists and detract from the historic nature of the town which attracts visitors throughout the year. Numerous pubs, bars, cafes and restaurants in the town already provide free Wi-Fi and facilities to make phone calls in emergencies. Therefore, the Hubs are not necessary or needed and given the location near to pubs and clubs, are likely to contribute to undesirable, anti-social behaviour at certain times. We should be trying to enhance and develop the Conservation area, not destroying it.
