**Your Comments:** I am concerned that the application will be pointless if approved. Most netting for golf protection has a recommended height of 15 metres as anything lower than this will not protect against a tee shot particularly given the distance from the first tee to the houses requiring protection.

If netting is the answer, could this not be angled from the treeline towards the fairway closer to the tee to catch 99.9% of wayward shots? This could be higher and a shorter length causing less impact to vista and wildlife whilst being more effective and less costly for the golf club.

Failing this, the clear answer may be to slightly amend the first tee position so that tee shots are directed more to the players right or to use an altered tree line on the players left.
