Dear Sir.

I am writing to you in regards to the planning application reference 3/2021/0579 for 14 Sheepfold crescent, the erection of the fence trellis.

I would like to object this application for the following reasons:-

- 1. I believe that this boundary fence actually belongs to me and therefore nothing should have been erected without my permission in the first instance. If I am wrong in the ownership of this fence I am happy to stand corrected.
- 2. The trellis that has been erected by the applicant is not in keeping with the trellis already in place in all the other neighbouring gardens and so I believe is aesthetically unpleasant.
- 3. The way in which the trellis has been erected is quite offensive visually from the neighbouring gardens. I am sure it looks great from the applicants viewpoint. However please see the attached photographs showing the view from my garden.
- It shows the difference between the existing trellis in all the neighbouring properties and the proposed trellis.
- It also shows the poor workmanship that does not fit flush with my fence and I am now faced looking at forever.
- We are all very house proud in this estate and we've all spent a lot of time and money making our gardens nice for my garden now to have this trellis just erected haphazardly.
- I feel even if I painted the trellis it would still look poor purely by how it has been erected.
- 4. If permission is granted for this trellis that Od not in keeping aesthetically or height wise that fits with the current fences, this sets a precedent for the future applications of neighbouring properties on the estate.
- From my garden I have boundary fences with two other neighbours who could potentially apply to erect a fence that exceeds current regulations, poor workmanship and is an eyesore. If this application is granted it would mean all future applications would surely have to be accepted. Where does that leave owners of properties?
- 5. From a personal point of view this fence has caused significant distress. The trellis was erected on my fence without permission. Then the applicant painted the fence in a shade of white, again with very little consideration for the neighbours. He did not forewarn us that he was painting the fence.

When I returned home one day, all my new black flags and new garden furniture had been damaged and splashed with white paint which I now can not remove and are now ruined.

I ask you please consider my objections before granting permission. I am more than happy for any planning officer to come and see the trellis from my garden to get a true understanding just how bad it looks to a garden I've invested so much time and money into to make look nice.

I would be most grateful if you could acknowledge receipt of this objection.
